C. ACTION ITEMS

Special Event Permit

1. Clearview Library District – October 28, 2014

Ally Garcia, Event Manager to appear on behalf of Clearview Library

Ms. Garcia, special events manager, explained that this is the second time that the event has been done by the library. She stated that the event is focusing on adult oriented programming in an effort to try to bring the community in to the library. The event will highlight businesses in the area that brew their own beer. They will explain the process of home brewing and there will be beer tasters from High Hops Brewery. High Hops will handle all the serving duties and they anticipate 30-40 people attending the event.

The Liquor Authority reviewed packet and stated that the diagram isn't clear as to the actual event location.

Ms. Garcia stated that the event is just in the Multi-Purpose Room which is closed in with just one access point.

The Liquor Authority stated that Ms. Garcia would need to submit a document which specifies the rooms location along with the size and location of liquor storage.

The Liquor Authority asked how they plan to identify people and make sure no underage drinking occurs.

Ms. Garcia stated that no children are allowed in the room and that she and a co-worker would be present during the entire event. They will check every one's ID at the door before they can enter to ensure that they are at least 21. The door is shut after the program starts so no one can enter after the fact. Ms. Garcia stated that there were no problems at the last event.

The Liquor Authority made sure Ms. Garcia understood that if there are any liquor violations that both the library and Ms. Garcia will be in trouble.

FINDING:

The Windsor Liquor License Authority reviewed the Special Event application and materials contained in the file, heard the testimony and considered the factors contained in Colorado Liquor Code and feels that the required criteria for issuance of a special event permit have been met. The authority approved the license renewal.

Renewal – Special Circumstances

Julian Oliveros, Manager to appear on behalf of Ayutla, Inc.

The Liquor Authority explained that when an infraction has occurred within the last year she requires the business to be present at their renewal hearing.

Mr. Oliveros stated that he is 50% owner of the business. He explained that the server who sold to the minor was new and usually there are classes that he has new employees attend but this new employee went ahead and worked without training. This was a mistake on his part that he let the employee work without the training. Since that time this employee has quit.

Mr. Oliveros went on to say that this was his first issue he has ever had with his liquor license. In the past he has had his employees attend liquor training here at Town Hall the the Police hold. He has not had any new liquor training since the violation.

The Liquor Authority still recommends classes for his employees and advised him to check with Loveland Police as they have a free class.

The Liquor Authority had Mr. Oliveros correct the renewal application to include the violation on question number 4.

Finding:

The Windsor Liquor License Authority reviewed the renewal application and materials contained in the file, heard the testimony and considered the factors contained in Colorado Liquor Code and feels that appropriate steps have been taken by the company to ensure no more violations occur. There have been no violations since the last occurrence which displays further evidence that these are effective. The authority approved the license renewal.
