New License

1. The Border

Hotel & Restaurant License
Michael Midkiff, Owner to appear on behalf of The Border

The Liquor Authority opened the public hearing.

Mr. Midkiff, owner, explained to the Liquor Authority that he owns a small 11 table restaurant. He serves lunch and dinner and breakfast on weekends. His hours of operation are Mondays through Thursdays from 11 am to 9 pm and Friday and Saturday from 7 am to 9 pm.

The Liquor Authority asked about where the alcohol will be stored.

Per Mr. Midkiff the alcohol stored in the back of the server area in a refrigerated display case. They will be serving beer in bottles and wine by the glass.

The Liquor Authority asked about his staff.

Per Mr. Midkiff his wait staff is experienced with alcohol service. He has 9 employees, 4 servers total, with 1 per shift.

The Liquor Authority asked about training.

Mr. Midkiff stated he is checking with the State for resources and will have his employees attend a Liquor Class

The Liquor Authority asked about his experience with liquor service.

Mr. Midkiff answered that he has none and will also be taking a class.

The Liquor Authority asked about his ID policy.

Per Mr. Midkiff, everyone who orders a drink will be carded.

The Liquor Authority asked about disciplinary actions of his employees should they serve to a minor.

He stated they would immediately be terminated.

The Liquor Authority asked about where the petition process he used.

Mr. Midkiff answered he petitioned people from the neighborhood and canvassed local businesses.

The Liquor Authority asked how long he had been in business.

The restaurant was opened in 1992 by his Mom and he has been running it for 5 months.

The Liquor Authority asked if there were in parties in interest in the chambers that wished to testify regarding this request to which there were none.

The Liquor Authority closed the public hearing.

FINDING:

The Windsor Liquor License Authority reviewed the new application and materials contained in the file, heard the testimony and considered the factors contained in Colorado Liquor Code and feels that the required criteria for issuance of a new Hotel & Restaurant License have been met. The authority approved the license.

2. Chili Thai Windsor Inc.

Jun Huang, Owner and Elaine Hu, manager to appear on behalf of Chili Thai Windsor

The Liquor Authority opened the public hearing.

Ms. Hu, manager of restaurant, explained that they are a small business with 17 tables and have both dine in and carry out service. They opened July 1, 2014 and serve Chinese and Thai food and they plan to start serving alcohol as soon as they are licensed. They are open Tuesdays through Thursdays from 11 am - 9 pm, Friday and Saturday from 11 am to 9:30 pm, and Sunday from 11 am – 9 pm.

The Liquor Authority asked Ms. Hu if she is the manager is she planning to register as the manager.

Ms. Hu stated that she will be registering as manager if they are approved.

The Liquor Authority asked about his staff.

Ms. Hu answered that there are 7 employees with 2 of them able to serve alcohol.

The Liquor Authority asked about training and their experience with liquor service.

Per Ms. Hu they owned a restaurant in the Metro Denver area and there they had training and all of those employees work at this restaurant. They had no liquor violations at their last restaurant.

The Liquor Authority asked about the owner's role in the business.

Per Ms. Hu he is the chef

The Liquor Authority asked about his ID policy.

Ms. Hu said that they will ask for all ID's, regardless of age.

The Liquor Authority asked about disciplinary actions of his employees should they serve to a minor.

Ms. Hu said they would notify the police, and either send them to training or terminate the employee.

The Liquor Authority asked if there were in parties in interest in the chambers that wished to testify regarding this request to which there were none.

The Liquor Authority closed the public hearing.

FINDING:

The Windsor Liquor License Authority reviewed the new application and materials contained in the file, heard the testimony and considered the factors contained in Colorado Liquor Code and feels that the required criteria for issuance of a new Hotel & Restaurant License have been met. The authority approved the license, conditional upon Ms. Hu registering as manager in the next 30 days.

The Liquor Authority opened the public hearing.

The publication was published on 11/20/14 in the Greeley Tribune and the premises were re-posted for the new hearing date.

The Liquor Authority asked Ms. Chan if anything had changed with her application since the November 17, 2014 meeting.

Ms. Chan, owner, stated that nothing had changed.

The Liquor Authority asked if there were in parties in interest in the chambers that wished to testify regarding this request to which there were none.

The Liquor Authority closed the public hearing.

The authority approved the location change.
