Parking for certain purposes prohibited



No person shall park a vehicle upon a roadway for the principal purpose of:

"(1) Displaying such vehicle for sale;

"(2) Washing, greasing, painting or repairing such vehicle except repairs necessitated by an emergency;

"(3) Displaying advertising."

"(4) Section 1204 is amended by adding Paragraph (1):"

"(1) Within an alley except during the necessary and expeditious loading and unloading of merchandise or freight. No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle within an alley in such position as to block the driveway entrance to any abutting property."

Section 1204(2) is amended by adding Paragraph (g) to read as follows:

"(g) Within less than two (2) feet clearance from adjacent vehicles."



Sec. 8-2-20.

Parking prohibited during certain hours.

No person, except a person on emergency calls, shall park a vehicle upon Main Street between 3rd Street and 7th Street in the Town between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. of any day.

The above sign is posted in several areas from 3rd Street to 7th Street.

Windsor Officers patrol the streets for parking violations. If you have received a parking violation notice you may pay the assessed fee, or go to Windsor Municipal Court on the arraignment date listed on your ticket.

Sec. 8-2-10 Parking Regulations

Parking of Boats, trailers or trucks upon the streets of the town.



Trailers:

No trailer shall be parked or stored upon the streets *unless* they are loading or unloading or involved in related activities, not to exceed 24 hours with a maximum of 4 twenty-four-hour periods in a calendar month.



Trailer coaches:


A trailer coach is a camper, as defined in the Colorado Revised Statutes.

The municipal code allows a camper which does not exceed (22) feet in over all length to be parked on the street as long as it is currently registered and legally parked.



Trailer Coaches and Motor Homes over (22 ft.), & Boats.

Trailer Coaches and motor homes over (22ft.) twenty-two ft. & boats may be parked on the street for loading and unloading purposes not exceeding a (24) twenty four hour period of time, with a maximum of not more than (4) four times in one month.



Construction Activities Parking

Parking your construction trailer on the street, in front of a new construction site legally, while actively working on the job site is permitted.

If you leave your construction trailer at the job site over the weekend, and you are not at the job site. It is suggested that you park it on private property. Please secure your trailer when you park it on the jobsite unsupervised during the weekend.



Sec. 1205 (1)

Cul-de-sac Parking

Front end parking in a Cul-de-sac is a violation of Sec. 1205 (1).

- All vehicles must be parked parallel with the curb. Vehicles may not be parked face in the end of a cul-de-sac.
- Passenger side must be towards the curb.
- Not more than twelve (12) inches from curb.

Sec. 8-3-20. Inoperable vehicles unlawful



Inoperable vehicle

An inoperable vehicle is any automobile, truck or self-propelled vehicle incapable of moving under its own power or which lacks a valid state license plate or does not comply with the minimum safety requirements of state motor vehicle laws.

Allowing an inoperable vehicle to remain in public view on private property outside of a storage facility/garage or parking an inoperable vehicle on the street is a citable offense.



Sec. 8-3-30.

Abandoned Vehicle Unlawful.

Abandoned motor vehicle:

If you must leave your vehicle unattended on any roadway in the Corporate Town limits, leave a note of your intentions with a phone number in the windshield, or contact the Police Department and advise them of your intentions.
