Get Involved

The Town of Windsor recognizes the need and desirability for shared stewardship and partnership with the community for cleaner public trails. The Town Board has created the Town of Windsor Adopt-A-Trail Program for individuals and organizations who wish to contribute to the effort of enhancing the quality and character of trails in the Town.

Commemorative Tree

The Commemorative Tree Program has been created as an opportunity to plant trees as living reminders of special people or special events.

Commemorative Trees can be purchased for \$250/tree. Planting a legacy for generations to come!

Commemorative Bench

The Commemorative Bench program offers the opportunity to dedicate a permanent reminder at a park or trail, of a special person or event.

Commemorative Benches may be purchased for \$1,000.00, which includes the strap iron bench that is the standard for all Windsor Parks, a plaque, installation and all concrete work necessary to place the bench on. Options for engraved stone plaques to be placed in the concrete are available for an additional \$350.00.

Time commitments will range from 5-10 hours per week. All qualified applicants must pass a background check and undergo park ambassador training.

Trail Etiquette

Trails are for non-motorized use including walking, running, cycling, and roller blading. In order to avoid conflicts please observe the following guidelines:

- Use common sense and courtesy.
- Stay on the right side with the flow of traffic.
- Groups should move to single file when other trail users are presents so that they may pass safely.
- Control your speed! Slow down and use caution when approaching or overtaking slower trail users.
- Be courteous! All trail users should be respectful of other users regardless of the type of recreation activity, speed, or skill level.
- Look at wildlife from a distance, leave wildflowers and plants for others to enjoy, and stay on the trail.
- Respect private property adjacent to trails.
- Assume motorist do not see you and that you do not have the right of way.
- Expect the unexpected, be safe.
- Practice the "Leave No Trace" principals Pack out what you bring in, including animal waste.


Trail Rules

Who Yields the Trail?

- Bicyclists and skaters yield to walkers.
- Bicyclists yield to skaters.
- Downhill users yield to uphill users.
- Faster users yield to slower users.
- Pass on the left giving an audible well in advance. A friendly greeting "passing on your left," or ringing a bell works well.

- Obey local regulations when using any trails
- Park only in designated areas
- Trail hours are dawn to dusk
- Non-motorized activities only
- Horses are not allowed
- Pets must be leashed
- Swimming not allowed (*applies to humans & pets*)
- No glass containers
- No fires, firearms (except in accordance with Colorado law), paintball, fireworks, or similar
- Pick up after your pet
- Stay on the trail - No Trespassing
