1. Arbor Day Planning/Mr. Kawamura-

- Tree Sale on April 18th from 10:00 am-12:00 pm at new Parks location-Public Service Campus 922 N. 15th Street, trees have been ordered and will be delivered the week of, cost is \$65.00/each, posted on Forestry webpage, will submit a marketing ticket to communications, will check all social media outlets, CRC will do all the orders
- White Spruce seedlings have been ordered for school distribution, Ms. Wilson and Ms. Bielawski will assist with packaging and counting when they arrive
- Poster and poetry contest, all schools have the information and eager to participate again, entries will be due by February 23rd and ready for voting at February 25th meeting, winners will be acknowledged at Town Board meeting on tentatively April 27th, posters will not be displayed at museum this year due to previously scheduled exhibit, Mr. Calvin will look into displaying at Clearview Library during month of April
- Shirts- new for winners and Board members, include Theme "Plant Small, Grow Tall"
- New Mayor will be sworn in on April 13th at Town Board meeting – reading of proclamation by Mayor Melendez on March 23th.

2. Set Goals for 2020-2021

 - Mr. Lucas suggested having a digital copy that can be edited and available online, Board would prefer hard copies as well
 - Ms. O'Connor will talk with Larimer and Weld County Extensions for assistance, include their logos
 - Include 8-10 trees for small yards and 8-10 trees for large yards, diagram for planting, include resource page with other links
 - Need to provide better handout list for Sick Tree Day as well
 - Design by Board and final product approved by Town
 - Wanting to be done before planting season
 - Pictures/photographs will need permissions to use, Mr. Kawamura/other resources have pictures on hand
 - Title/name TBD
 - Targeting for June 1st completion
- Clearview Talks scheduled
 - May 13th Mr. Kawamura and Ms. O'Connor - Emerald Ash Borer
 - Sept. 9th Mr. & Mrs. Monroe - Replacement Trees
- Tree Symposium last year – possibly every other year goal, focus for 2021
- Year End Report – presented last night at Town Board meeting by Ms. O'Connor, printed and verbal report, went very well, will present again in January 2020
- Park Audits – in lieu of meeting, one park a year

E. COMMUNICATIONS

1. Communication from Town Staff

- Mr. Kawamura –
 - November/December Highlights – pruned and removed Silver Poplars at 7th and Eastman Park Drive, removed trees at tree nursery in preparation for detention pond, cleaned and moved storage yard to new site, collected over 800 Christmas trees for recycling and Magical Forest event on March 8th at Eastman Park South, 1 landscape inspection
 - Move to Public Service Campus (922 N.15th Street) starting this week, offices next week, same phone numbers
 - Greeley Tree Care Workshop is Friday, February 21st – please let ken know if interested in attending, Ms. O’Connor and John Ball will be presenting, cost is \$30.00, Ms. Wilson will attend
- Mr. Lucas –
 - Forestry adding staff member - seasonal part-time/year round, 20 hours/week for Treasure Island, \$13.93/hour, Mr. Kawamura will notify Ms. O’Connor when position is posted
 - Adopting Public Art Plan by Town Board in February, various public art by neighborhood districts
 - Phase I River Walk Eastman Park project – design bid due February 5th, will create 400 spaces for parking, in/out access for kayak/tubing, cutting back riverbank to create natural seating/viewing, Poudre Trail fast track around Treasure Island
 - Kyger Trail is under construction, hoping for completion by April– master plan for public input
 - Pedestrian bridge at CR13 trailhead/392 to connect to Kyger and High Hops, will create 2/3 loop through Windsor
 - Frank State Wildlife area – seeking to acquire easement, goal is to open for recreation
