




## **Poudre Pooch Park**

Bring your pooch for exercise and social time to Poudre Pooch Park.

Poudre Pooch Park is fully enclosed and is over an acre. The park is off Eastman Park Drive west of 7<sup>th</sup> Street. If you choose to drive, you can park your vehicle in the gravel lot west along Eastman Park Drive where the street curves to the south. Walk north from the parking lot along the path to Poudre Pooch Park. Poudre Pooch Park is south of Whitney Ditch. Bags are available to clean up after your pooch.

While walking to and from Poudre Pooch Park make sure to have your dog on a leash.



**Park hours: Dawn to dusk, daily throughout the year.**

**Please read and follow the posted rules and regulations!**

### **Sec. 11-8-50. Dogs**

Dogs shall be allowed in public parks and on trails within the Town under appropriate supervision and specifically in accordance with the provisions appearing elsewhere in Windsor Codes concerning dogs.



### **Number of dogs in one household**

Harboring over four (4) dogs over the age of six (6) months old upon any property without a kennel or breeders license is prohibited.

### **Dog Bites**

Dog bites should be reported to Windsor Police Department.

### **Cats**

Cats are not governed by the Town of Windsor Ordinances.



**Windsor Lake offers an enclosed area on the northwest side of the lake where your dog is welcome to play in the water.**

### **Windsor Municipal Animal Codes**

Windsor has dog codes to encourage responsible ownership.

Ownership is a privilege and a large responsibility.

The purposes of animal control codes are to protect the public health and safety, and to keep owners from allowing their dog to be a nuisance to their neighbors and the community.

These same laws also protect animals from cruel treatment, neglect, and injury.

**This Brochure has a brief summary of the codes pertaining to animals.**

## **Running at large**



### **Sec. 7-6-60**

Dogs at large in the community are not only a nuisance and can be dangerous to the public, but are in danger from cars, irate people, fox, coyotes, and sometimes other dogs. For these reasons all dogs must be on a leash held by a person or under control on the owner's property at all times.

Dogs found running at large in the community will be taken into custody. The owner will be notified, providing the dog is wearing an identification tag or has a micro chip inserted with updated information.

### **Redeeming your in custody dog.**

The person claiming responsibility for the dog must first contact the Windsor Police Department prior to attempting to pick up their dog.

After the penalty assessment or summons is issued to the responsible party, the responsible party's copy of the ticket must be presented to Garden Valley Vets before their dog is released.

## **Nuisance Barking Dog**

### **Section 7-6-70**

Allowing a dog to habitually bark, howl, or yelp consistently, thus disturbing the peace of the community, is a violation of this code and may be a citable offense.



## **Identification Tag Required**

### **Section, 7-6-20**

Windsor's ordinance requires all dogs residing in the corporate town limits to have an identification tag securely affixed to a collar and on the dog at all times.

Inserting a micro chip that provides current owner information is another form of identification.

Not displaying an identification tag with current information displayed on your dogs collar or having a micro chip inserted into your dog with current owner information recorded with the chip company is a citable offense.



## **Rabies Vaccination Required**

### **Section 7-6-30**

Windsor requires all dogs over 6 months old, residing in the corporate town limits, to be vaccinated against Rabies.

## **Feces**

### **Sec. 7-6-190.**

#### **Public nuisance prohibited**

Private yards and dog runs must be cleaned on a regular basis to prevent odor and build up of feces.

### **Sec. 11-8-60.**

#### **Removal of dog waste required.**

The owner or keeper of any dog shall be responsible for the immediate removal of any feces deposited by such animal on a sidewalk, along an easement, or in any public park, and on or adjacent to any trail within the town.



## **Article IX Keeping of Chicken Hens**

### **Sec. 7-9-20 Keeping of chickens: limitations and requirements**

Residents are allowed 6 chicken hens after obtaining a permit through the Town Hall and have a structure that is predator proof. Please see Article IX in Windsor's Municipal Code Book regarding Keeping of Chicken Hens in its entirety prior to purchasing your hens.

### **ARTICLE VII**

#### **Bees and Beekeeping**

Please see Sections 7-7-10 through 7-7-120 in Windsor's Municipal Code Book regarding bee keeping.

### **Sec. 7-5-20.**

#### **Keeping of hard hoofed animals and domestic fowl prohibited.**

Except as otherwise specifically authorized in this Code, it shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor, maintain or allow to run or fly at will any hard hoofed animals or domestic fowl within the Town.
