

**MUNICIPAL COURT, TOWN OF WINDSOR, STATE OF COLORADO**

---

**ORDER ESTABLISHING AND CONTINUING VIOLATIONS BUREAU AND SCHEDULE OF FINES AND BONDS**

---

Pursuant to Rule 210 CRMCP, the Model Traffic code as adopted by the Town of Windsor, and the ordinances of the Town of Windsor, the Court is authorized to and hereby establishes and continues the procedures for the payment to the Court Clerk/Violations Bureau according to a fine schedule in lieu of appearance in court. IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. The Court Clerk/Violations Bureau shall act under the direction and control of the Court.
2. Unless prohibited by this order, the Windsor Police Department is authorized to issue penalty assessment notices for violations of Windsor Municipal ordinances and the Town Clerk, Court Clerk, or other such persons designated by the court, are authorized to accept payment for such notices according to this schedule of fines in lieu of court appearance. Except when a mandatory court appearance is required, any person charged with a violation may pay the designated fine and applicable surcharge for the charged violation prior to the date and time set for the first appearance.
3. A penalty assessment notice may not be issued, and a summons and complaint shall issue when:
  - a. A violation results in personal injury, death or property damage in excess of \$750;
  - b. The violator is charged with a misdemeanor AND is under 18 years of age;
  - c. The provisions of the Model Traffic code prohibit the issuance of a penalty assessment notice;
  - d. In the officer's discretion, the violation is aggravated or habitual.
4. If the arresting officer has reasonable grounds to believe that a defendant will disregard a written promise to appear, the officer may require the defendant to post a personal recognizance bond in the amount of \$300 or the amount of the fine listed on this schedule.

**5. SCHEDULE OF FINES-TRAFFIC CODE**

Fines may be increased by \$50 if the violation involved an accident. Fines shall be doubled for speeding violations occurring in construction or school zones.

a. MTC violations: Except as otherwise indicated, the fines for point violations issued as a penalty assessment shall be as follows:
