

TOWN OF WINDSOR

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-1610

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE REGULATION OF DOOR TO DOOR CONTACTS BY THE TOWN OF WINDSOR, COLORADO, REPEALING SECTIONS 10-4-140 AND 10-4-170 AND REPEALING, AMENDING AND READOPTING SECTIONS 10-4-150 AND 10-4-160 OF THE *WINDSOR MUNICIPAL CODE*

WHEREAS, the Town of Windsor (“Town”) is a Colorado home rule municipal corporation, with all powers and authority vested by Colorado law; and

WHEREAS, door to door contacts for any purpose are an expression of “free speech”, protected by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, any governmental regulations implicating the First Amendment must be content-neutral and narrowly tailored to a legitimate governmental purpose; and

WHEREAS, the appellate courts have refined the law to a point where the Town must amend our existing code language; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has reviewed the within Ordinance, including the additions and modifications set forth below, and has concluded that the public health, safety and welfare will be promoted by the adoption of the within Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF WINDSOR, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. *Windsor Municipal Code* Section 10-4-140 is repealed.

Section 2. *Windsor Municipal Code* Section 10-4-170 is repealed.

Section 3. *Windsor Municipal Code* 10-4-150 is repealed, amended and readopted to read as follows:

Sec. 10-4-150. Attempt to obtain invitation prohibited.

No person shall attempt to obtain, by telephone or otherwise, an invitation to visit any private residence or other private premises, by knowingly making a false or deceptive representation or statement.

Section 4. *Windsor Municipal Code* 10-4-160 is repealed, amended and readopted to read as follows:

Sec. 10-4-160. Signs prohibiting solicitation and/or trespassing.

(1) No person shall enter or remain upon any public or private premises in the Town, unless invited or requested by the occupant or occupants thereof, when a "No Solicitation" or No Trespassing" sign is posted at or near the entrance to such premises.




